About the Purple Heart Project (PHP)

What is the Purple Heart Project?

The Purple Heart Project (PHP) is a U.S. Veteran's Service charity recognized under Internal Revenue Code (IRC) 170(b)(1)(A)(vi) since 1 July 2022 and is exempt from federal income taxes under IRC 501(c)(3). PHP's U.S. FederalID / Tax number is 88-2217122. The PHP is also a nonprofit corporation, incorporated in the state of Washington and is a Washington state registered charity. The PHP's Washington state unified business number (UBI) is 604 974 078.

The Purple Heart Project's mission is to introduce physically and mentally combat wounded Veterans, still suffering from the negative effects of combat, to the peace and joy that can be found through the therapy of traditional hand tool woodworking.

About the Purple Heart Project (PHP)



How Does the PHP Accomplish its Mission and Achieve its Vision?

The PHP accomplishes our mission by providing selected combat wounded Veterans with a PHP scholarship to attend one of Rob Cosman's Training the Hand Workshops. The selected combat wounded Veterans are fully funded for travel, per diem, and tuition to attend Rob Cosman's week-long Training the Hand Workshop. In the workshop they learn all the basic hand tools skills needed to build furniture without machinery; no dust, no noise, no danger.

During the week, PHP scholarship selectees form lifelong bonds with fellow Veterans and students, become a part of the PHP family, and learn how much others value their selfless service. We provide each Veteran with their



own set of high-quality hand tools to take home with them. Once selectees return home our Bench Brigade volunteers build and deliver to the selectees a premium workbench.

Through our outreach programs, PHP maintains a community for these combat wounded Veterans to stay connected to their newfound woodworking buddies and the PHP program. The positive result is focused energy on woodworking to chase away the negative effects of combat, provide a feeling of purpose and accomplishment when building something with your hands, and the lifelong support of a community that honors their service.

Message from Executive Director

In 2023, together with your support, the Purple Heart Project (PHP) was able to serve 42 combat wounded Veterans. These 42 Heroes learned hand tool woodworking skills, were provided tools and workbenches, and become part of the supportive PHP community of woodworkers so that they may find the peace and joy they richly deserve.

We are so appreciative of our donors and want them to know that we are fully committed to enriching the lives of combat wounded Veterans. PHP is a small organization, but our size enables us to provide focused and personalized support to the Veterans who come through our program, which is not possible in larger organizations. The skills and lifelong friendships Veterans forge through our program allow them to progress in their healing journey.

As a small and relatively new Veterans service charity, we faced and conquered many challenges in 2023 - our first full year of operation. Our primary goals in 2023 were to properly organize our accounting and bookkeeping system, establish our donation system, set up our online and social media presence, bring on key volunteers, and of course meet our goal of serving 42 combat wounded Veterans through our woodworking program. We are happy to report that we achieved all of these goals and are well situated to move forward to 2024. Unfortunately, our 2023 expense to service ratio was 10% higher than we desired. This was the result of several one-time start-up costs, including switching bookkeeping firms due to unsatisfactory service, and costs incurred to apply for Canadian charity status. We are confident that we will be able to significantly reduce our expense ratio in 2024 down to our goal of 5% or lower.

We are proud to report that 100% of our Board of Directors and the people who do the heavy lifting of making PHP run are volunteers. Their service allows us to maximize the percentage of donations that directly serve combat wounded Veterans.

As we move into 2024. the Board of Directors has set a goal of becoming a 4-star rated charity by the popular rating service Charity Navigator. We know the importance that donors and the public place on financial stewardship, transparency, and the high standards expected of non-profits. We hold ourselves to these standards of excellence.

Thank you again for a remarkable year. We look forward to advancing our mission with you in the years to come.


